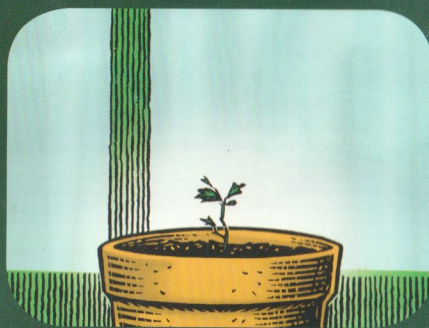

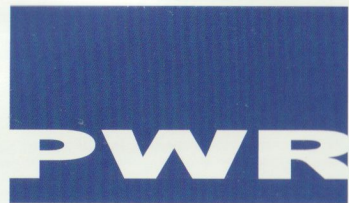


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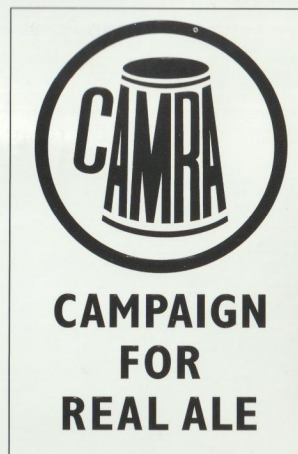

Welcome to the 1st Greenwich Beer & Jazz Festival!

To help you make the most of your visit here are some helpful hints, tips & guidelines:

- Everyone attending will purchase a glass on entry (£3), which is yours for the duration of your visit (so please look after it!) If you wish, you can take it home as a souvenir, or return it as you leave the Festival and obtain a full refund.
- Your free souvenir Festival Programme contains lists of all the Beers, Ciders and Perries on offer ... now head for the bar!
- Popular and unusual beers sell out fast! If there is a high demand for a beer you want to try, don't leave it too long before you buy!
- Please ask for tasters before you buy a beer if you're not sure. However, there will be a limit to such requests at busy times.
- Soak up the beer at the Festival Food stalls where you'll find a variety of organic and traditional options available.
- Toilets will be clearly signed within the event. Please use them sensibly and let a member of staff know if you spot any problems.
- Support the cause by joining the Campaign for Real Ale (CAMRA). Visit the CAMRA website or pick up a leaflet from the Membership Stand at the Festival.
- The Festival is a Non-Smoking venue, like restaurants and pubs. Smoking will be permitted outside the marquees.
- The Organisers promote responsible drinking at all times. Please pace yourself as anyone found to be intoxicated will be removed from the event.
- Persons under 18 are only permitted entry to the event accompanied by a 'Before 5pm' ADULT ticket holder. Children under 18 will NOT be admitted to the event after 5pm or into the event enclosure after 5.00pm.
- Persons under 18 are not permitted to consume alcohol at the event.
- There will be a full 'Challenge 21' policy in place both at the entry point and service points and refusal of service of alcohol will be implemented in all cases where satisfactory photo ID cannot be produced.
- No alcohol may be brought into the event. Alcohol bought on the premises may not be consumed in Greenwich Town Centre where an alcohol ban is in place.
- Possession, sale or consumption of Class A, B and C drugs is not permitted
- All bars close at 10.30pm.

Welcome to the first Greenwich Beer & Jazz Festival where we have a wide range of beers on offer of varying strengths & styles from all over Great Britain!

From light pale ale through to a rich dark stout, with a number of wheat & golden summer drinking beers. If you are unsure about any of the beers, please do not hesitate to ask any of the volunteers behind the bar, but for the true British beer experience, the only way is to sample a number at our festival.

Bear in mind that some beers take longer to be ready to drink (so we won't put them on until they are just right!) and others will run out as the festival goes on.

If there's a visible label on a barrel behind the bar this indicates it's on; if there isn't, it's not! Labels not attached to casks indicate beers on hand-pump.

Come on - get tasting!

BURTON BRIDGE - Burton-upon-Trent, Staffordshire

SOVEREIGN GOLD 4.0%

Golden beer with citrus aroma. Bitter yet smooth, brewed with Cascade & North Down.

BRAMBLE STOUT 5.0%

Strong, chocolaty aroma with a hint of fruit. Full bodied taste with smooth bitterness made with Challenger hops, pale and chocolate malts.

BUTCOMBE - Bristol, Somerset

BITTER 4.0%

A notably bitter, amber beer. Clean tasting, refreshingly dry & distinctive from 100% English malts.

BLONDE 4.3%

A clean tasting, refreshing & drinkable premium beer made with finest Sloverian, Styrian & Saaz hops.

CAIRNGORM - Aviemore, Scotland

TRADE WINDS 4.3%

Light golden colour with a high proportion of wheat giving the beer a clean fresh taste. The mash blends with the Perle hops and elderflower, providing a bouquet of fruit & citrus flavours.

WILDCAT 5.1%

A deep amber coloured ale with a complex malt and fruit flavour, with a delicate bitterness from Challenger and Fuggles hops. Strong and distinctive.

CASTLE ROCK - Nottingham, Nottinghamshire

HARVEST PALE 3.8%

A blonde straw-coloured bitter. Brewed with a gently-kilned malt, an aromatic blend of American hops added during the brewing process.

ELSIE MO 4.7%

The name derived from the low colour Maris Otter malt from which she's exclusively brewed, gives her that tantalizing golden hue.

COTSWOLD - Foscot, Oxfordshire

PREMIUM 5.0%

Crisp & full flavoured premium lager made from Liberty & Hersbrucker hops & Maris Otter malted barley.

THREE POINT EIGHT 3.8%

Light, refreshing continental style lager. Delicate blend of Saaz, Styrian, Goldings & Cascade hops and Optic malted barley.

WHEAT 4.2%

Originally planned as a spring special this Berliner Weisse Wheat Beer proved so popular it's now available all year round! A lighter style Wheat beer so perfect for enjoying in the sunshine.

DARK STAR - Haywards Heath, W. Sussex

HOPHEAD 3.8%

An extremely clean-drinking pale gold-coloured ale with strong floral aroma & Elderflower notes. Full-bodied, despite its very quaffable strength and dryness.

HYLDER BLONDE 4.2%

A delicate and lightly hopped beer with the fresh fruitiness of elderflowers.

SUMMER MELTDOWN 4.8%

Well balanced, golden bitter with the warm flavour of Chinese stem ginger & other spices. The perfect thirst-quencher for a summers evening.

DENT - Dent, Cumbria

RAMBRAU 4.5%

A very pale, cask-conditioned lager Ale. The flavour is sweet malty, rather hoppy, but also with notes of yeast and fruit.

KAMIKAZE 5.0%

Hops and fruit dominate this full-bodied gold coloured strong bitter, with pleasant dry bitterness growing in the aftertaste. Citrus and honey in the aroma, with a hint of spiciness in the taste.

EXMOOR - Wiveliscombe, Somerset

GOLD 4.5%

An enticing gold-colour with a grassy and floral aroma. Bittersweet with hints of citrus fruit.

BEAST 6.6%

Dark, mahogany-brown ale with an aroma of toffee, treacle & mocha coffee. A bittersweet finish is smooth yet complex, rich but not cloying.

FENLAND - Ely, Cambridge

SMOKESTACK 4.2%

Dark chocolate with a subtle hoppy bite.

GOACHERS - Maidstone, Kent

REAL DARK MILD 3.4%

A full flavoured dark mild brewed with chocolate & black malts, hopped with Kent fuggles.

SILVER STAR 4.2%

A low colour, dry hoppy brew.

GOLD STAR 5.1%

True draught pale ale made with floor malted barley, hopped with East Kent aroma hops.

HALL & WOODHOUSE - Blandford St. Mary, Dorset

BADGER FIRST GOLD 4.0%

A golden ale with a pronounced hop aroma, underlined roasted malt flavour. Clean yet slightly spicy.

TANGLEFOOT 4.9%

A light golden coloured ale with floral overtones, balanced with biscuit & fruit notes.

HARVEY'S - Lewes, East Sussex

SUSSEX BEST 4.0%

A full well hopped bitter with a reputation exceeding the borders of its native & adjoining counties.

HOLDENS - Dudley, West Midlands

BLACK COUNTRY MILD 3.7%

A bold chestnut-red mild with nutty biscuit notes & a delicious hint of a chocolate. Brewed with amber, black and caramalt and choicest fuggles.

GOLDEN GLOW 4.4%

A golden ale with subtle yet fragrant hop aromas. Enjoyable gentle sweetness & almost citrus-like pleasant bitter finish.

HOPBACK - Salisbury, Wiltshire

ENTIRE STOUT 4.5%

A rich dark stout with a strong roasted malt flavour and a long, smooth aftertaste. Suitable for vegans.

SUMMER LIGHTNING 5.0%

A straw-coloured beer with a terrific fresh, hoppy aroma. Coupled with an intense bitterness, produces an excellent long, dry finish.

ICENI - Thetford, Norfolk

CELTIC QUEEN 4.0%

Golden in colour, a light refreshing tasting ale.

FEN TIGER 4.2%

Red/golden colour, malty beer brewed with coriander. A fine distinctive taste.

LODDEN - Dunsden Green, Oxfordshire

FERRYMAN'S GOLD 4.4%

Golden smooth body with masses of zesty, aromatic Styrian Golding hops.

MEANTIME - Greenwich, London

CHOCOLATE 6.5%

Dark malts & even darker bitter chocolate. Like drinking chocolate made with rich, bitter chocolate. The ultimate chocoholic beer - warm, comforting, rich and rewarding.

PILSNER 4.7%

Crisp, bitter and refreshing. A lager malt and Perle & Halletauer hops. Gentle maltness on the nose deceives as a massive hop flavour envelopes the tongue. Delicately hued Pilsner true to German style.

WHEAT 5.0%

Wheat & pale ale malts, Perle & Northern Brewer hops & authentic wheat beer yeast. Cloudy, golden/orange beer with banana, toffee, bubblegum, spicy & zesty aromas & flavours. Created in true Bavarian style with special yeast.

COFFEE PORTER 6.0%

Unique roastiness of Fairtrade rich Arabica coffee beans & dark barley malts. Coffee bitterness balanced by vanilla sweetness to create an espresso/mocha experience. Is it coffee or beer?

RASPBERRY 6.5%

A tangy tongue-tickler with raspberries added to a wheat beer base. Vibrant red colour, fruity nose, balancing sweet & sour on the palate. Wildly refreshing zesty finish makes it an ideal cleansing digestif.

INDIA PALE ALE 7.5%

May best be described as a glassful of hop wine. A light copper coloured beer stuffed full of Fuggle & Goldings hops, giving out ginger notes and flavours of Seville orange marmalade.

LONDON STOUT 4.5%

"Black Velvet" made with Brown and Black malts & Goldings hops. Made without roast barley (as used in Irish descendents) dark malts & London water for a beer of great complexity. Soft mocha coffee & vanilla notes; palate of caramel, molasses & nut roast, gives way to a gentle maltbitter dryness.

LONDON PALE ALE 4.3%

Malt sweet, hop bitter. Pale Ale malts, Golding, Cascade & Cluster hops combine for traditional, classic English style beer. Complex, heady mix of spearmint, grass and 'hop sack' aromas. A very dry finish with a slight lingering bitterness, characteristic of the Pale Ale style.

UNION 4.9%

Dark, delicate, malty Viennese Lager with Cascade, Perle & Spalter hops. Deep copper-coloured beer with firm fruity caramel aroma. Slow fermented & cold-matured for perfect balance.

MILESTONE - Newark, Nottinghamshire

HOPTIMISM 3.8%

Light golden refreshingly hoppy, distinctive floral aroma.

BLACKPEARL 4.4%

Authentic Irish stout with notes of burnt toast and coffee.

LITTLE JOHN 5.0%

A traditional old English ale, with toffee and caramel flavours.

RASPBERRY WHEAT BEER 5.6%

Continental style fruit beer, mouth filling fruit, with zingy finish.

NELSON - Chatham, Kent

MASTERMATE MILD 3.7%

A dark mild with a smooth malt and hop flavour, leaving a roasted aftertaste on the palate.

TRAFALGAR 4.1%

A light easy drinking ale with a balanced malt and hop flavour. A hint of honey & nuts to finish.

SPANKER 4.2%

A fruity ale with a smooth predominance of hops giving a refreshing feel on the palate.

LOOSE CANNON 4.4%

A copper coloured autumnal ale with a warm roast flavour & a good taste of hops to finish.

DOGWATCH STOUT 4.5%

A smooth creamy stout with strong hop tastes to leave a smokey, chocolate aftertaste.

FRIGGIN IN THE RIGGIN 4.7%

A very drinkable premium bitter with a smooth malt flavour, leaving a bitter sweet aftertaste.

NELSON I.P.A 4.8%

A traditional I.P.A complex in taste leaving a dry hoppy finish.

NELSONS BLOOD 6.0%

A strong malty ale with mellow roast tones, slightly nutty and fruity made with fuggles & goldings hops.

NOTTINGHAM - Radford, Nottingham

DREADNOUGHT 4.5%

Rich ruby coloured premium bitter with a well rounded fullness of malt & deep strength of hop bitterness.

OAKHAM - Peterborough, Cambridgeshire

J H B 3.8%

A golden beer whose aroma is dominated by hops that give characteristic citrus notes. Hops and fruit on the palate are balanced by malt, and a bitter base.

BISHOPS FAREWELL 4.6%

A strong premium beer of structured quality dominated by elaborate fruity hop notes, with a grainy background & dry finish.

OAKLEAF - Gosport, Hampshire**I CAN'T BELIEVE IT'S NOT BITTER 4.9%**

Clean & crisp with a fruity aftertaste. The use of Saaz hops gives this lager a citrus finish that lingers on.

HOLE HEARTED 4.7%

Brewed with 100% Cascade hops. This powerful, floral and fruity beer will surprise with every mouthful.

RAMSGATE - Isle of Thanet, Kent**No.7 3.8%**

Deliciously satisfying classic season bitter using local fuggle hops. Dry & bitter with English hop flavours & aromas.

SEASIDER 4.3%

Pale amber-coloured ale. Clean crisp & bitter using goldings & fuggles. This 'one off' brew proved so popular it's become a regular.

STORM WARNING 5.0%

A strong dark ale with a hint of rich, burnt caramel flavour with pleasing maltiness & sweet hoppy finish.

SALOPIAN - Shrewsbury, Shropshire**LEMON DREAM 4.5%**

A modern style English wheat beer using a small amount of fresh lemon to compliment the citrus flavours produced by the wheat malt.

SHARDLOW - Shardlow, Derby**NARROW BOAT 4.3%**

A pale amber bitter, with a short crisp hoppy aftertaste.

SHARP'S - Wadebridge, Cornwall**CORNISH COASTER 3.5%**

A fresh aroma of hops blends seemingly with light fruity sweet notes. In the mouth a hoppy bitterness.

DOOM BAR 4.0%

An accomplished balance of spicy resinous hop, inviting sweet malt & delicate roasted notes.

SHEPHERD NEAME - Faversham, Kent**MASTER BREW 3.7%**

A clean, dry, refreshing session bitter with a touch of sweetness, but displaying an assertive & vibrant hop with a lingering bitter finish.

SPRINGHEAD - Newark, Nottingham**LEVELLER 4.8%**

Dark, smoky, intense flavour with toffee finish. Brewed in the style of Belgian Trapist ales.

ROARING MEG 5.5%

The smooth, sweet "big blonde" with a dry finish and citrus honey aroma.

TIMOTHY TAYLOR - Keighly, West Yorkshire**LANDLORD 4.3%**

A classic strong pale ale, with a complex & hoppy aroma. Has real "pulling" power in any bar!

TITANIC - Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire**STEERAGE 3.5%**

This beer embodies the opulence of the finest ingredients. Sit back, relax & enjoy this refreshing, clean, hoppy golden bitter and let the fruit, malt & hops carry through to the aftertaste.

ICEBERG 4.1%

A combination of Maris Otter pale malt and fine wheat malt, give this refreshing beer real zest. Add fresh tasting Yakima Galena & Cascade hops and what you get is a fantastic wheat beer.

TWICKENHAM FINE ALES - Twickenham, Middlesex**SUNDANCER 3.7%**

A crisp & hoppy session bitter. A touch of amber malt provides a pleasant biscuity edge to this pale golden coloured ale. A blend of British & American hops add wonderfully floral & citrus-like, dry finish.

TWICKENHAM ORIGINAL - 4.2%

A ruby coloured, malty best bitter. Maris Otter pale malt combined with dark and light crystal malts, caramalt, and a touch of roasted barley gives this lush, malty ale a reddish brown hue. A light touch with First Gold, Mount Hood and Bramling Cross hops allows the rich, full flavour to shine through.

WEST BERKSHIRE - Frilsham, Berkshire**MR. CHUBB'S LUNCHTIME BITTER 3.7%**

A traditional style beer with 100% English hops & a good bitterness balanced by Maris Otter malts from Wiltshire & Suffolk. Named in memory of the brewers father, former lock-keeper at Witchurch-on-Thames.

DR. HEXTERS 5.0%

A light coloured beer with a full fruity flavour, made distinctive by American hops.

WESTERHAM - Edenbridge, Kent**SUMMER PEARL 3.8%**

This Golden ale is dry hopped with Hallertauer Perle hops, imparting a spicy & refreshing finish.

FREEDOM ALE 4.3%

Kent Northdown hops give a clean refreshing full bodied flavour for which Kent Ales are famous. Finchcock's Kent Goldings for flavour and aroma.

WHITSTABLE - Whitstable, Kent**PEARL OF KENT 4.5%**

Tropical fruits flavour this light coloured & well-rounded premium beer. A jewel amongst ales.

KENTISH RESERVE 5.0%

A copper coloured ale with warm plum pudding flavours & a ruby port finish.

WICKWAR - Wickwar, Gloucestershire**LONG JOHN 4.2%**

Full of hops "till the last drop", a beer created to promote the Long John Silver Trust in Bristol.

STATION PORTER 6.0%

A smooth dark ruby-brown with roast malt, coffee & rich fruit aroma. Long, smooth, warming finish.

WOLF - Attleborough, Norfolk**COYOTE 4.3%**

A full-bodied premium straw coloured ale. Complex but well balanced mix of hops and malt leads onto a crisp well hopped final.

WOLF IN SHEEPS CLOTHIING 3.7%

This traditional Norfolk mild has a malty aroma with fruity undertones, lightly hopped with fuggles & goldings this beer has a long clean finish.

LAVENDER HONEY 3.7%

Honey infused with lavender from the Norfolk Lavender Company is added during the brewing process to give this beer a delicate yet more-ish flavour.

PRAIRIE GOLD 5.0%

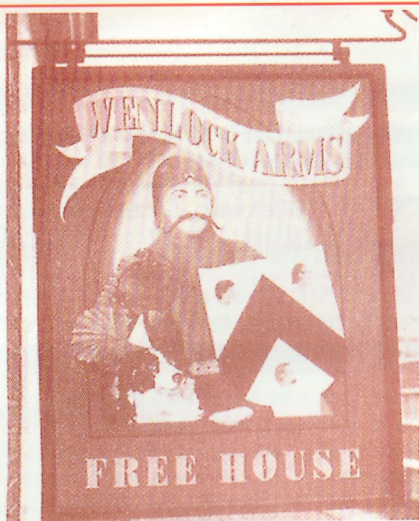
A golden summer ale, brewed with American hops for a crisp citrus finish.

WOODFORDE'S - Norwich, Norfolk**MARDLER'S MILD 3.5%**

Gentle, delicate, sweet roasted malts combine with a low hopping rate make this traditional East Anglian mild an ideal appetizer.

WHERRY 3.8%

This ale is fresh and zesty with crisp floral flavours. A background of sweet malt and hoppy 'grapefruit' bitter finish characterises this champion beer.

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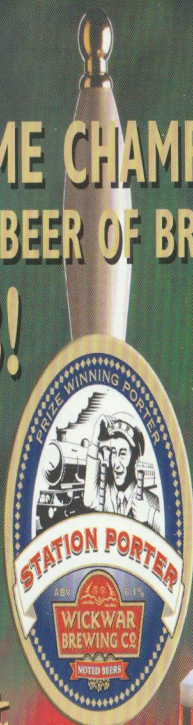

BIDDENDEN - Kent

Bushells Medium 6.0%

An old Kent favorite from a vineyard that has been making cider since 1978.

CASTLE - Kent

Medium 7.5%

A clear and easy drinkable cider from Kent, Set up in 1987 and only uses Kentish Apples.

CROSSMAN - Somerset

Single Variety 6.0%

Well known traditional unfiltered cider using many different varieties of Somerset apples.

GUILLET - Brittany, France

Medium Dry 5.0%

The Guillet family of Guenrouet in Brittany has been making cider for over 70 years, using the finest selection of Breton apples to create a well balanced cider.

GWYNT Y DDRAIG - Glamorgan

Medium Dry 6%

Started producing cider in 2001 using traditional methods & winning a number of awards.

NAISH - East Pennard, Somerset

Dry 7.0%

Working their farm since 1937, the brothers are amongst the cider industries great characters. Most cider is oak fermented. Highly regarded cider.

NEW FOREST - Hampshire

Medium 7.5%

Kingston Black Medium 7.5%

Founded in 1988, they have a display of vintage presses & a regular stall at Borough Market.

OAKWOOD - East Sussex

Medium Dry 6%

Organic as certified by soil association and that is all we know about this producer!

PALMERS - Devon

RICH - Somerset

Sweet 6%

A popular all rounder, using only Somerset Apples to make a traditional unfiltered cider. Matured in huge oak vats, the largest holding 10,000 Gallons!

SEIDR O SIR - Mid Wales

Dry 7.5%

Founded in 2000, this small producer's apples come from Radnorshire orchards.

SEVERNSIDER - Gloucestershire

Medium 7.0%

Small family business sourcing fruit locally from unsprayed & unfertilized orchards to produce a drink free from harmful chemicals. Selecting fruits from traditional, vintage varieties for best flavours.

SPRINGFIELD - Monmouth

Old Barn 7.2%

Winner of several 2007 awards with ciders made exclusively from carefully selected & handpicked apples, grown in their own orchards. Strong and fruity, this cider is made from a blend of late season Browns & mid-season Dabinetts.

THATCHER'S - Somerset

Medium Heritage 5.3%

The Thatcher family has been associated with cider for almost 100 years. Their cider is allowed to mature in oak vats ensuring the full flavour of the apple is captured. Their production facilities are amongst the most advanced in the cider industry,

WESTCROFT - Somerset

Dry Janet's Jungle Juice 6.0%

John Harris has been making cider since 1992 but his grandfather made it here at the same farm with the same apples. A large Wassail always takes place on the third Saturday after Xmas. Silver National Cider Championship 2008.

W.M. WATKINS - Gwent

Rum Cask 7.1%

A new producer of a popular cider being conditioned in Rum Casks.

WILKINS - Somerset

Medium Sweet 6%

Founded in 1917, Roger Wilkins is a well known character who has been producing since 1966. Good favourite cider.

BROOK FARM - Gloucestershire 6.0%

When Mr. Kearns moved into the farm in 1997 he didn't intend to be a cider maker, but not wishing his sheep to eat the apples he started producing some and things have grown from there!

CLIVES - Worcestershire 6.5%

Made with fruit from their own extensive orchards in the shadows of the Malvern Hills, the Clive's Fruit Farm was founded in 1911. Mr. Clive senior was a pioneer of 'Pick Your Own' in the 1960's, an innovation still very evident today.

DAYS COTTAGE - Gloucestershire 7.5%

Using old varieties of pear from restored orchards. The fruit comes only from unsprayed orchards. Dozens of different varieties are used, some unique to the county.

HARTLAND - Gloucestershire 6.0%

Three generations have been producing cider 'not filtered' - but as Mr. Hartland says "has no bits floating around in it". Winner of Bronze - National Perry Championship 2008

HECKS - Somerset 6.5%

Cider makers since 1840, matured in wooden barrels. National Cider & Perry Awards BRONZE award 2005.

GWYNT Y DDRAIG - Glamorgan 6.0%

Started in 2001, making cider and perry using only traditional methods & winning several awards.

NEWTON COURT - Hereford 7.5%

Founded in 2000, making Perry using traditional methods from organic orchards & winner of many awards.

OLIVER - Herefordshire 7.0%

Made in small batches using fresh (mostly hand picked) unsprayed fruit with minimal intervention, this craft producer (founded 1999) respects great heritage & traditions of the past whilst innovating for the future, including a 'mySpace' entry!

ORCHARDS - Gloucestershire 6.4%

From the Wye valley with Perry pears from their own (and other local orchards) which have old traditional "full standard" trees, the majority of which is hand picked.

ROSS-ON-WYE - Hereford 6.5%

Set up 7 years ago by a cider enthusiast with increasing planting of more orchards for the future. Silver National Perry Championship 2008,

TROGGI - Monmouthshire 6.2%

Only founded in 1986, this producer sources apples only from Monmouthshire & has won many awards.
