# Festival Info

## Opening Times

The festival is open 12pm-10.30pm each day, with last orders at 10pm.

## Your Glass

This year we have decided to trial including a non-refundable glass within the entry price. Whilst we appreciate some of you would prefer to have the choice of whether or not to keep your glass, we hope you will understand our desire to reduce the financial risks of our first festival in three years. In addition, you will also receive a free packet of Pipers Crisps on departure (while stocks last). To ensure you get a full measure, our glasses are oversized and lined.

## Drinks Pricing & Payment

Drinks may be purchased in pint, half-pint or third-pint measures. Prices are displayed on the end of each cask / box and in general vary according to alcohol strength.

This year the beer and cider bars accept card or token payment only. Payment in cash can, however, still be made at the entrance desk where drinks tokens can be purchased in multiples of £5. Refunds will be given for the value of any unused tokens.

## Off Sales

The festival is licensed for the sale of beers and cider/perry to be consumed at home. Please note that only unopened bottles or draft beer/cider/perry in closed containers (we can provide these) may be carried home from the festival. Please note that such take-outs must not be consumed outside the festival venue or in the street.

## Toilets

Toilets are clearly signposted as you exit the main club bar.

## Allergens

Please ask for full details if required. Unless otherwise notified:

**Beer:** will contain gluten in the form of Barley or Wheat; **Cider/Perry:** may contain Sulphites;

**Food:** please check with the food staff if you have an intolerance to any of the 14 notifiable allergens.

## Re-Entry to the Festival

If you need to leave the festival and wish to return later the same day, please obtain a wristband to ensure you are not charged another entrance fee upon your return.

## Smoking

Smoking is not permitted anywhere inside the club building or the marquee, so please move outside of these areas to smoke.

## Disabled Access

If you wish to avoid the step at the front of the venue, please use the entrance at the rear where ramps are available.

## First Aid

Trained first aiders are on duty. If you require any assistance, please contact the nearest member of festival staff.

## Charlton Park RFC Bar

The club bar will be open from where soft drinks and alcoholic drinks can be obtained in addition to beer and cider. These drinks must be paid for at the club bar and not at the festival bars.

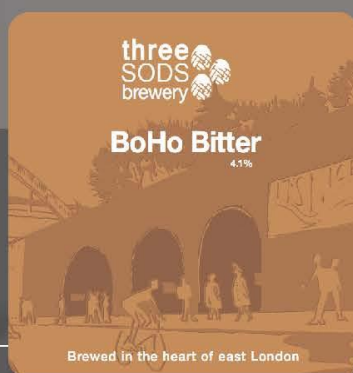

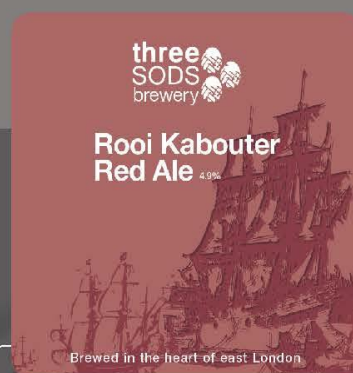
## VAPOUR TRAIL (3.8%)

A lovely beer packed full of flavour without the high ABV, a very drinkable session beer which is light and refreshing. This beer uses one of the latest varieties of British Hybrid hops and is a popular choice amongst the easy goers.



## BOHO BITTER (4.1%)

A classic English Bitter with a modern twist. A perfect balance of bitterness combined with American Belma and Styrian Wolf hops.



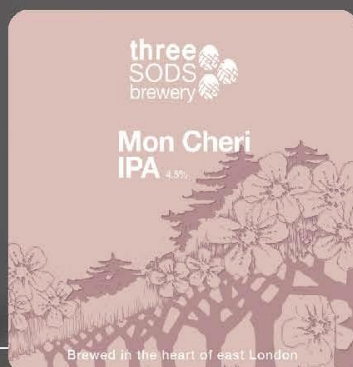
## ROOI KABOUTER (4.9%)

A full-bodied red ale. Roasted and red malts bring a blend of sweetness and bitterness, while the European hops deliver a powerful, floral aroma. Meaning Red Dwarf in Afrikaans, this is a truly stellar beer.



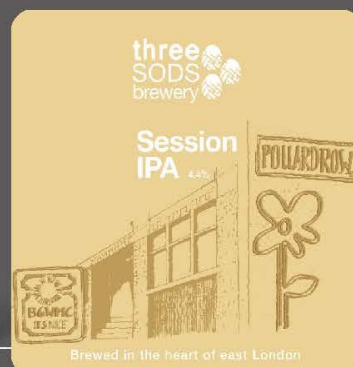
## DARK MAGUS MILK STOUT (4.7%)

Named after our favourite Miles Davis album, an ode to smoothness and style. A blend of chocolate, roasted barley and crystal malts packs this stout full of flavour and body.



## MON CHERI IPA (4.5%)

A well rounded IPA. Subtle hints of citrus in a background of stonefruit followed with undertones of white wine. This IPA has an a-typical malt bill for a beer of this style that gives it complexity, a good depth and medium body.



## SESSION IPA (4.4%)

A light and hoppy, low ABV India Pale Ale, packed full of fruity notes with a Chinook kick and a grapefruit bitter finish.

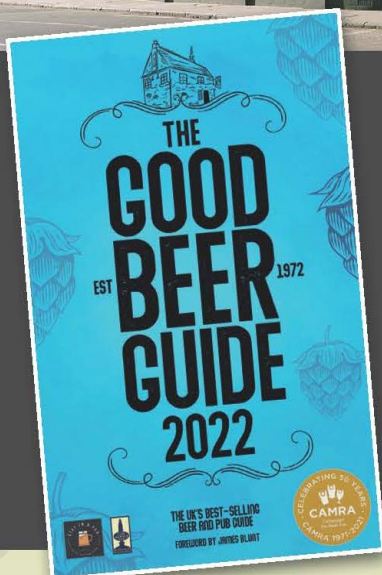
